Review	After grandhowl I explained to the Cubs that we were going to be looking at Diwali and I asked them if any knew about it. A few did as they had learnt about it at school. I explained this is the most important celebration for Hindu's and we would be doing some activities to also celebrate it. The pack was then split into their four sixes for the bases I'd organised The cubs seemed to like the different activities, the air drying clay was a bit messy. Once all the cubs had completed the activities we all sat together with the lamps they'd made in front of them. The leader found some tea lights, put them in and lit them. When the cubs were quiet I told the Cubs the Diwali story, the cubs who said earlier said they knew it and we talked about the different characters.
